



The masterplan, in addition to the upgrading and selective redefinition of the featured "Discovery Gardens", includes a new 8,500 square foot multipurpose Education Pavilion which will be created and anchored at the southern end of the grand allee. It will focus around a central interactive water feature with large covered porches flanking the main facility. The goal is to achieve a LEED Silver rated, sustainable facility.

The original 1936 Centennial Exposition era Dallas Horticulture building, with additions in 1955 and 1969 is being renovated and redesigned by Oglesby•Greene to accommodate Texas Discovery Garden's new mission and program needs for education, visitor services, exhibits, gift shop and year-round butterfly house and insectarium interactive exhibit. The original bas-relief panels on the exterior front will be restored. The butterfly house will be a multi level interactive visitor experience commencing at the upper level and spiraling from above the tree canopy down, through and below the tropical zones amidst myriads of international butterfly species.
