



The Trammel Crow Visitor Education Pavilion is the product of a very successful collaboration between Oglesby Greene and Lake Flato Architects of San Antonio.

Oglesby Greene participated in the design development and shared responsibilities for the completion of interior design, construction documents and construction administration.

The Arboretum's desire for this project was to construct a building that blends in with its surroundings, joins the environment of the Arboretum and allows patrons to filter in and around the facilities provided for the public. It was also their expectation to create an architecturally significant building as an attraction to the greater community.

The enclosed portions of the project total approximately 40,000 sf and include an exhibit hall, gift shop, orientation theater classrooms, administrative spaces, catering kitchen and grill. On the grounds, there are spaces and accoutrements for entertainment, public gatherings, education and diverse displays of vegetation.
